Guided Reflection: Psalm 95 - Josh Reeve

1 Come, let us sing for joy to the LORD; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. 2 Let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song.

Make a list of God's gifts to you in the past year that you are thankful for. Spend time in gratitude and worship, thanking him for each one.

How can you incorporate thankfulness into your daily life as a regular discipline?

- 3 For the LORD is the great God, the great King above all gods.
- 4 In his hand are the depths of the earth, and the mountain peaks belong to him.
- 5 The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land.

Write down as many words as you can think of that describe God's character. Spend a few moments praising God for who he is.

6 Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the LORD our Maker; 7 for he is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care.

Think through a time of trial in your life. How did God grow your faith during that time? Looking back, how can you see God's care and faithfulness?

What are two or three aspects of friendship with God that you are most thankful for?

Today, if only you would hear his voice,

8 "Do not harden your hearts as you did at Meribah, I as you did that day at Massah in the wilderness,

9 where your ancestors tested me; they tried me, though they had seen what I did.

10 For forty years I was angry with that generation; I said, 'They are a people whose hearts go astray, and they have not known my ways.'

11 So I declared on oath in my anger, 'They shall never enter my rest.'"

In what areas of your life do you most struggle to believe in God's character? Put another way: In what ways do you most struggle with fear right now? Confess these to God and pray about them.

Have you ever experienced disappointment with God that has led you to be more closed off to the vulnerability of friendship with him? Ask God to soften your heart.

EXERCISE What would you say is the Big Idea of Exodus 12?

How do the two ideas complement each other?



Getting to Jesus - Naomi de Vries

WHY DO WE CONNECT THE OLD TESTAMENT TO JESUS?

1.The Bible is one big story

"Every passage of Scripture-in both the Old and New Testaments-either predicts, prepares for, reflects, or results from the work of Christ." C.J. Mahaney

- 2. All scripture bears witness to Jesus
- 3. The Old Testament finds its fulfilment in Jesus
- 4. Connecting to Jesus helps prevent us making moralistic applications

HOW DO WE CONNECT THE OLD TESTAMENT TO JESUS?

Method 1. What is God doing?

- What is God doing in this story?
- How does God do the same for us but better in Jesus?
- How does believing this change how we live?

Method 2. Who is God?

- What does this Bible passage teach us about who God is?
- How is this aspect of God revealed in Jesus?
- How does believing this change how we live?

Method 3. How does Jesus help?


- What problem/tension is left unresolved in this passage?
- How is this solved in Jesus?
- · How does believing this change how we live?

Applying to Life - Tim Beilharz

HEAD application: "What do I know , or what do I believe , now that I've heard this truth."
HEART application: "What can I say to God now that I've heard this truth?"
HANDS application: "What is Jesus calling me to do today or this week now that I've heard this truth?"
EXERCISE How might you apply the 10 Commandments to children in your ministry?
How can you grow their knowledge (HEAD), love (HEART) and obedience (HANDS) to King Jesus?
How can you make sure your application reflects the Gospel, and not moralism or legalism?

Handling the Tricky Bits (Under 5s) (continued)

3. Three examples from Exodus



• Death (Ch11-12 – Death of firstborn son)



• War (Ch17 – War with the Amalekites)



• Tricky law (Ch20-24 – about Law)

A child under 5's world is one where following rules often means reward, so we need to remind them of GRACE, GRACE. The grace of God in the gift of salvation in Jesus.

- the Red Sea


Start by reading aloud the verses below.


Then act it out in a short, simple version with your paper pieces.

N.B. In a normal week of preparation, you could check your dialogue in a Pre-schooler's Bible like "The Beginners Bible"


